


To all of our teachers, staff and SJB families, we would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and well wishes for a safe and happy new year.




Moquequa, Peru

Hogar Belen is a community of the Congregation Our Lady of the Missions caring for abandoned and handicapped children and adults. The Covid-19 pandemic has brought its share of suffering to the people around Hogar Belen. The WHO has reported almost one million infected people and over 36,000 deaths.

Queen of the Missions Afternoon School

Park Circus, Kolkata, West Bengal, India

Queen of the Missions Afternoon School provides free education to some 240 girl students. The majority of the children live in squatter settlements along the railway tracks. Their parents earn their wages as day workers, rag pickers, rickshaw pullers, or coolies. These families do not have access to any of the basic amenities. There is no ready water or drainage facilities.

The people are recovering from the aftermath of cyclone *Amphon*, a challenge now compounded by the pandemic. Repairing their makeshift houses, providing food, clothing and other basic needs is a daily struggle. The Sisters are ministering to the families by addressing their physical and emotional needs in the hope that the children can continue their education. Your financial gift will contribute not only to their education but to their very survival – a Christmas gift that will make a difference.

In the event of a severe weather emergency, all Catholic Schools will close if the Winnipeg school divisions close their schools. Listen for school closures on CBC, CJOB, 99.9 FM, 94.3, 102.3 FM and 103 FM. In case of an emergency that requires us to evacuate, students will go to Ecole J.B. Mitchell.
