#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Families and Friends,

September has been a great success and I am very much looking forward to the upcoming year. This month we have reconnected with old friends and welcomed new friends to our community. This year is of particular importance to St. John Brebeuf School as it marks our 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary! Staffed by the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary, the school doors opened on November 25<sup>th</sup>, 1957 with 123 students and four classrooms. The school uniforms were maroon instead of navy, an answer for those of you have ever wondered why our P.E. uniforms are maroon. The teaching staff was mostly made up of nuns, with only a few lay teachers. An additional six rooms were added to the school in 1961, bringing it to its current size. Mass was celebrated in our gymnasium until completion of the church in May of 1966. The parishioners of the time felt very strongly that the school should be completed before the church. We thank the Sisters of the Holy Name of Jesus and Mary, the Jesuit fathers, and our early parishioners for the dedication they showed to Catholic education, a dedication that remains an integral part of our community today.

Our first Mass honouring our patron saint St. Jean de Brebeuf was held on his feast day, September 26<sup>th</sup>. St. Jean de Brebeuf was an extraordinary man, martyred for his faith, who had a great facility for languages. He lived among the Huron-Wendat people in New France and quickly mastered the Huron language, writing Canada's first Christmas carol: the Huron Carol.

Earlier in the month, our new students and staff were welcomed into our community by receiving a virtues cross and being inducted into a house. I am proud of our virtues program and house system, both well- established programs that have become part of the fabric of what it means to belong to this community. They promote a positive, empowering culture by fostering ties between students and staff across grade levels, and guidance in developing strong characters. September finished with the Terry Fox walk giving students the opportunity to be present in the neighbourhood, build community within their houses, and raise money in support of cancer research. A special thank you to the parent council for providing ice cream for our students on the playground after the walk.

There are many opportunities for our students to become involved in extra-curricular activities. Our sports programming is up and running with two volleyball teams, running club meeting Tuesdays and Thursdays, and intramurals beginning once the weather turns cooler. There are also ample opportunities for our students to become involved in music clubs, with six different clubs and choirs being run over the lunch hours. Practices for our Christmas concert will start in October, with students in grades 6-8 encouraged to try out for a role.

Social justice will continue to be at the forefront this year as we continue with our various initiatives. Care and concern for those in need is a vital part of our Catholic faith and an essential part of our programming at St. John Brebeuf. We will continue to look for ways to increase sustainability thereby caring for God's creation. A reminder to our parents when sending snacks to school *for sharing with the class* to please opt for healthy choices, *even on birthdays*. If any parents are interested in assisting with the healthy schools committee, please contact the office.

I would like to thank all our staff for their commitment and dedication to enriching our children and bringing out the best in them. At St. John Brebeuf we strive to help all our students reach their full potential in a caring and safe environment. I am proud of all our students and their accomplishments, both big and small.

I am looking forward to a busy Autumn term, and would like to wish everyone a happy Thanksgiving.

## **Celebrating 16 Years of the Virtues Project**

The Virtues Project was created by psychotherapist and author, Linda Kavelin Popov (2000), to create an environment of caring and inspires the practice of virtues in everyday life. This will be the 16<sup>th</sup> year that St. John Brebeuf School has been practicing the virtues! Each month, the school community learns one of fifty-two virtues.

During the 2016 to 2017 school year, the theme of the Virtues Project was **sustainability** in connection with Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato si'* (*Care for our Common Home*). For the 2017 to 2018 school year, continuing with the second theme of sustainability, we will focus on virtues which relate to "**respect and concern for other people in the local community and other places in this world**" (<a href="http://www.edu.gov.mb.ca/k12/esd/pdfs/k-4">http://www.edu.gov.mb.ca/k12/esd/pdfs/k-4</a> brochure.pdf). This also correlates with Pope Francis' urge towards **solidarity** (ie. Catholic Social Teaching). Considering this, the prayer of St. Francis provides a strong anchor.

#### **FLU & COLD SEASON**

As the days get cooler, it is important that your child is dressed appropriately for patrols and outdoor recess. Like Winnipeg School Division, we use Environment Canada at the airport to determine indoor or outdoor recess. Including the wind chill, we go outside at -25 or warmer and stay inside at -26 or colder.

Children should be kept at home when they are sick. A sick child has a difficult time concentrating on school work and may pass their illness to other students or staff. There are times when students are unable to take part in outdoor recess because of injuries they have experienced. Children unable to participate in recess due to illness however, should remain at home to recover.

Besides staying home when sick, children are encouraged to make healthy choices at school and at home such as washing their hands often with soap and water, and covering their nose and mouth when sneezing.

#### **TERRY FOX WALK**

Terry Fox envisioned a marathon, a marathon of hope that he began in 1980. On September 29th, the students of St. John Brebeuf School had the opportunity to hear guest speaker Brenda Krueger from the Terry Fox Foundation. She spoke to the children about her experience with cancer as well as the inspiration that Terry Fox was to many. The students were given an opportunity to see the advancement that research dollars have made in the development of artificial legs as Brenda showed them a replica of Terry Fox's leg and a new version. She also told us that in the past 12 years, St. John Brebeuf has raised over \$25,000.00 through our Terry Fox walks. The students then continued Terry's vision by walking 2.5 km around the neighbourhood. The Terry Fox committee would like to express gratitude to the staff and students of St. John Brebeuf for their extraordinary efforts in keeping Terry's dream and vision alive. A huge thank you to all our parent volunteers who came out to support us.

#### **Physical Education**

Welcome back students and families of the St. John Brebeuf school community! I hope everyone had a safe and active summer. The first week back to physical education had all students playing a series of low organized games. During the first few months, students from grades K-4 will be developing their basic movement skills – run, jump, hop, gallop and skip. Students in grades 5-8 will be learning the rules and skills required for Team Handball and developing their understanding of Volleyball.

Please help your children with being prepared for Physical Education by having their crested gym shorts and shirts **labeled** with their name along with non-marking running shoes in a **labeled** gym bag. Labeling their regular uniform is equally important. Please do not send casual "Crocs" or "skateboard/street" shoes, they do not provide adequate support. Also, please remember to write your child's first and last name somewhere inside their clothing. If students forget to bring these items to class, a uniform sheet will go home with them for you to sign. Please have your child return the sheet to me the next day for my records and so that I know you have received it.
