

Grade 6 building electrical circuits with U of M student scientists

We have been quite busy in grade six for the past couple of months. Some highlights are participating in the school science fair, a Lent retreat, and field trips to the Red River Stevenson Aviation Training Center. At the Stevenson Avia-tion Training Center, students used their knowledge of the principles of flight and applied them to real-world scenarios. Students were able to participate in some of the training and skills that aviation engineers have to do on a daily basis. We were able to get close and personal with many plane models and explore their various components. In social studies, we learned about the Canadian contributions to World War II. We inquired about various topics of interests and created learning games to communicate the significant information in them. We then explored and played each others' learning games. We are saddened at the fact that the girls in our class are leaving and we wish them well in their future. What a wonderful year we have had and I am sure you will each have many more wonderful years ahead!



This was the final term for all of us before we entered high school. With our eyes looking towards grade nine, we still had lots to do here at St. John Brebeuf. In math, we figured out how to calculate the surface area and volume of 3D shapes. We explored how the surface area per unit of volume increases as your object gets smaller, which explains how bugs can fall far distances without getting squished. We also looked at probability with casino games and found that no matter what you bet on in a roulette game, the long-term payout will be the same. In science, we played a computer game called Cellcraft in order to learn about the inner workings of cells. We then looked at cells in a variety of places, including eyes and plants. One hundred years have passed since the Spanish flu, and we learned about how Winnipeg banded together to assist each other without caring about what neighbourhood or socioeconomic background you came from. In history we learned about the Ma-yan Empire and the Middle Ages, making our own family coat of arms. We joined up with the grade two class to analyze the environmental themes in the book The Lorax. The book I Am David, which explores a boy who escapes a concentration camp in order to search for his mother, was our focus in literature. Of course, not everything we did was academic. Many of our classmates lead the school's soccer team in the tournament at Grant Park. We traveled with the grade 7s to Quebec City, Montreal, and Ottawa. Some of our notable moments were exploring the Montmorancy waterfall, the smoked meat sandwiches in Montreal, and the War Museum in Ottawa. We also had a great tour guide, Jean-Francois, who knew a lot about everything we saw, and had many great stories and facts to tell. Eight of our students also received the Sacrament of Confirmation at the beginning of June, which has been something we have been preparing for since January. We explored how the act of accepting the Holy Spirit into our lives requires having an open heart, and that the work to live like Jesus did will continue throughout our lives. Thanks for everything, St. John Brebeuf, and goodbye!

The grade seven class completed a busy spring full of anticipation. They were eagerly awaiting the cultural trip to Quebec and Ottawa. The waiting proved to be justified as they returned with glowing reviews of their experiences. The trip was a learning experience on an academic, cultural, and social level. Upon their return, the mindset shifted to prepare for the June exams looming around the corner. Ultimately, the goal of finally reaching grade eight, the pinnacle year at St. John Brebeuf, is quickly approaching. Striving to prepare for the exams and achieve academic success was a topic echoing between the classroom walls. Their courses led them through various avenues of learning. The completion of an independent novel study and We All Fall Down by Eric Walters sparked, not only their curiosity, but a self-reflection into their own lives. Building connection between themselves and the characters from a modern day historical fiction novel, opened their eyes to the interconnected web that is our world. The students attacked algebra problems with vigour and accurately created graphs during their math lessons. They enthusiastically produced beautiful pieces of visual art using a variety of mediums, including pastels and charcoal.

The grade sevens ventured outside of the SJB walls several times this season. They attended a retelling of the Jules Verne classic "Twenty Thousand Leagues Under the Sea" at the Manitoba Theatre for Young People. Although an unknown story for many of the students, the modern twist on the classic tale was enjoyed and sparked discussions in the classroom. The students participated in a call to action by supporting the elderly, the young, and the environment. Responding to the call from Pope Francis to use our gifts and talents to help others is an important aspect of developing the students in our community.

Applying their technology skills and talents was evident as the academic year came to a close. Creating a professional level PowerPoint based on their experience at the National Museum for Human Rights was a lesson in not only culture, but also in the effectiveness of a strong presentation. Using the iPads, the students expressed their learning in new and exciting methods. The confidence and knowledge to use the technology at their finger tips is a goal for the students as they prepare for their final year at St. John Brebeuf.

NOTES FROM THE MUSIC ROOM








St. John Brebeuf School recognizes the accomplishments and contributions that the grade six girls who are leaving our school have made to the community. We
