






# PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE







#### Dear Families,

With the second month of school drawing to a close, the safety of our students and staff continues to be a priority at the school. With the school response level recently raised to orange, we are now offering a blended program for our students. Families have the ability to temporarily opt for either in school or remote learning for the duration of the orange level response. Most of our students have elected to remain in class for the time being, but we do have some students who are remote learning. These students will stay connected to the classroom via live classes during the school day, and individual teacher contact time throughout the week. Families have the option to move between in class and remote learning if they find that their chosen option is not working for them.

While the school year has been different thus far, some things remain the same. When I visit classrooms, I still see happy, engaged students and excellent teaching happening. Things may look slightly different with desk shields and masks, but the core of what we offer to our students remains unchanged.

I want to thank PAC who have remained active this year despite unique challenges, and found a way to offer hot lunch, popcorn days, and a Thanksgiving treat to our students. Your role in keeping the parent community engaged is invaluable.

A big thank you to our staff who have adjusted and dealt with changing circumstances over the past seven months, and have done so with grace and without complaint.

And, of course, thank you to you, our families, for your support through this time, and your adherence to our safety procedures. We could not achieve what we do for our students without you.
